

A four-year volunteer and past member of the board of directors, Menzies is the new manager of the shop at 461 Beatty Ave., north of the railroad tracks.

With five years of retail clothing Arm should go without. experience in her own business and 15 years in the human resources field, Menzies, says she loves the interaction with people - volunteers and the people who shop in the store. And she is very committed to the shop's mission - to provide household and personal effects to those in need, at low cost or even no-cost when necessary.

A veteran new-to-you shopper herself, Menzies says thrift store staff love the environmentally con-

scious shoppers who buy secondhand and make up about 50 per cent wrap bandages for shipment to othof the store's clientele.

"I really believe in what we do here," says Menzies, "It's not only to the member churches to be used

a great store, we help people in need."

She says there is excellent communication between the community's various groups and that nobody in Salmon All they have to do is ask for help, she says. And if they can't find what they need in her Lynda Menzies store, she knows where

Menzies is amazed by the enthusiasm and caring given by the volunteers who represent the community's churches: people who dedicate many hours to sort through clothing, unravel wool, take jigsaw puzzles home and put them together to make sure all the pieces are there and er countries.

Profits from thrift store sales goes

Two weeks ago, three large green garbage bags filled with winter coats were shipped to Afghanistan. Regular shipments of clothing to Mexico is also part of the store's outreach.

The Churches Thrift Store is open Monday through Thursday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.




