





Volunteers build better lives

Charity project: Church team heading to Zambia to install roof on a medical clinic.

Members of a local clearly are going to take the roof, in Africa.

A neum affiliated with St. Andrew's Prostrytorian Clearch will travel to the village of Ndofa to Zambia in April to add the roof to a new medical clinic

The congregation has already mised the \$34,000 needed to build the clinic, which will be used to proride care to 64 AIDS-infected orphass, and eventually, another 64 children from the community.

The fundraising project was prosented to the church AGM a year ago. by Maye Case, who is 2006, saw first hand the work being dose in Africa by the Abbotsford-based Seeds of Hinne.

"It stated when a group of ladies responded to stories of AIDS ophan, who were dying without ever knowing luman touch," says Casn of the Lewer Mainland organiratios. "They responded by going over to Tholland, and now they've recohecomed into (providing aid to orphonal six coungries."

In 2000, Seeds of Hope porchased a borne in Ndola that became Buncko Orphange, a shelter for some 40 children infected and affected by AIDS and HIV.














The Director

THRIFT SHOP WAS STARTED BY FOUR CHURCHES

The Churches Thrift Shop was started by four, not three churches as stated here last week. Fifty years ago Salmon Arm was one square mile, and its four churches were Pentecostal, Anglican, United and Catholic. Today the thrift shop has 15 past employees, plus Saturday trams of four workers times four, and 250 volunteers every week.

Fifteen churches provide volunteers and donations of used goods and receive their share of the profits after grants and scholarships are distributed. The churches are Shuswap Community Church, Anglican, Evangelical Free, Catholic, Christian Reform, Deo Lutheran, Presbyterian, Free Methodist, United, Five Corners Pentecostal, Seventh Day Adventist, Living Waters Pentecostal, Church of Christ, Mountain View Baptist, and Lakeside Community.

burgers & hotdogs. Adding to the meal was a delicious selection of pot-providence salads & desserts.








2014 - St. Andrew's Christmas Eve Candlelight Service
